

# Section 2: Sons of God as Elohim

### Scriptural Basis:

- **Genesis 6:2**: "The sons of God (*bene elohim*) saw the daughters of men." The sons of God are divine beings, part of the *Elohim* collective.
- **Job 1:6**: "The sons of God (*bene elohim*) came to present themselves before the Lord." These are angelic or divine entities in God's council.
- **Psalm 89:6**: "Who in the heavens can be compared to the Lord? Who among the sons of God (*bene elohim*) is like the Lord?" Affirms their divine status.

### **Key Points:**

- The "sons of God" (*bene elohim*) are divine beings, angels, or members of the heavenly council, sharing the *Elohim* title as subordinate creators or agents.
- They appear in pre-Flood contexts (Genesis 6) and heavenly scenes (Job 1), showing their role in God's plan.
- The Knowledge of God helps the Elect discern these divine beings' roles, as seen in the Angels Calendar's Pre-Flood era.
