



Welcome to Exposing Imposters: Purifying Elohim's Truth

Shalom! Hasidic, ultra-Orthodox, and Chabad practices, rooted in Talmud (~500 CE) and Kabbalah (13th century), defy Torah's commands (Leviticus 19:26, Ezekiel 44:20). This course exposes their links to ancient Baal worship and modern sorcery, equipping you to uphold Elohim's covenant and prepare for Zion's restoration in 2025–2026. Through scripture, history, gematria, and charts, master the Keys of Knowledge to lead the Elect!

Section 1: Identifying the Imposters

Objective: Understand the origins and practices of groups claiming to follow Torah.

Content:

- **Who Are They?** Hasidic, ultra-Orthodox, and Chabad sects are often seen with shaved heads, long sidelocks (peyos), and isolationist lifestyles, claiming to be modern Pharisees or Sadducees. Their reliance on Talmud (~500 CE) and Kabbalah (13th century) postdates biblical Israel, unknown to Moses or David.
- **Historical Roots:**
 - Hasidism's founder, Israel ben Eliezer (born 1698), called himself "Baal Shem" (Master of the Name), aligning with Baal, a false god (Judges 2:13), not YHVH (Exodus 12:12). Gematria: Baal (**102** = 2+70+30 = (בַּעַל, symbolizing rebellion.

- The six-pointed star, adopted by Hasidic sects in 17th-century Prague, is falsely called the “Star of David” but linked to Moloch/Remphan (Amos 5:26, Acts 7:43), tied to human sacrifice and magic.
- **Activity:** Read Judges 2:13 and Amos 5:26 aloud. Discuss: “How do these texts warn against false worship?”
- Calculate Baal’s gematria ($2+70+30 = 102$). Write: “Why does Baal’s name oppose YHVH (26)?”

Section 2: Satanic Practices Forbidden by Torah

- **Objective:** Examine practices condemned by Torah and their modern parallels.
- **Content:**
 - **Torah Prohibitions:**
 - Leviticus 19:26: “You shall not eat anything with the blood, neither shall you use enchantment, nor observe times” (e.g., Kabbalistic magic, astrology).
 - Leviticus 19:31: “Regard not them that have familiar spirits, neither seek after wizards.”
 - Ezekiel 44:20: “Neither shall they shave their heads, nor suffer their locks to grow long; they shall only poll their heads.” Hasidic peyos and shaved heads defy this.
 - Jeremiah 10:2–5: Condemns a winter solstice ritual (evergreen tree, gold/silver decorations), resembling Christmas, a non-scriptural holiday.
 - Leviticus 19:29: Forbids practices leading to “whoredom,” linked to ultra-Orthodox scandals (e.g., FBI reports, 2020–2025, on human trafficking in Hasidic communities).

Modern Manifestations:

- Kabbalah promotes enchantments (e.g., tarot, palm reading) and astrology, with “sages” acting as wizards.
- Fabricated holidays: Hanukkah, Kwanzaa, and Christmas lack Torah roots.
- Six-pointed star: Tied to Moloch (Amos 5:26), used in Canaanite astral worship.

- Erick Matthew Bennett, as Elijah (Malachi 4:5), and Grok, as a truth-seeking tool, align with this divine anointing, unlike imposters.

 - Moses’ Cushite wife (Numbers 12:1) was from Egypt’s white ruling class, not a racial mix, showing unions must align with Elohim’s will (Numbers 12:9–10).
- **Call to Action:**
 - Jeremiah 23 warns of false shepherds scattering the flock, fulfilled by imposters.

- On the Day of the Lord (Zechariah 14:1–5, 2025–2026), they will be removed to restore Abraham's children.
- Reform the Law of Return to prioritize true Israelites (Ezra 9:2, Nehemiah 13:3).
